We expect our children to reach high levels of attainment in a school community where people work co-operatively, valuing and respecting the contribution of both adults and children.

At Hardwick Primary School we endeavour to create a caring, interesting and secure environment where our children can grow in confidence and develop into independent individuals, able to show enthusiasm for all they do.

To help us achieve these aims, the staff, Governors and some parents have developed a Home/School Agreement. In this Agreement we have outlined:-

The School's responsibilities in relation to its pupils

The parents' responsibilities while their child is registered at the School

The School's expectations of its pupils

The School promises to ensure that:

- ❖ Children are well taught, cared for and treated fairly
- ❖ Concerns of families will be heard and discussed, and resolutions worked towards
- ❖ Parents are kept informed about the curriculum and are invited to be involved in school activities
- ❖ Parents are offered regular meetings with their child's teacher
- ❖ Parents are given early warnings of any problems with their child's work or behaviour and that appropriate action will be taken in cases of misconduct or unauthorised absences

The Parents promise to ensure that:

- ❖ Their child's attendance is good
- ❖ Their child arrives safely at school for the start of the day (between 8.50 and 9.00 a.m.) and is collected on time at the end of the day (3.15 p.m.)
- ❖ They inform the school of reasons for a child's absence by telephone or by letter on the first day of absence
- ❖ They will encourage their child's efforts and ensure that regular time is spent on reading practice.
- ❖ They support the school's ethos and caring attitude to others and their property
- ❖ Their actions promote the safety of ALL children
- ❖ Their child's clothing and personal equipment is clearly labelled

The Pupils will try to make sure that they:

- ❖ Attend regularly and arrive at school on time
- ❖ Behave well and are kind and helpful to each other
- ❖ Take good care of their school and their possessions
- ❖ Always try hard and take pride in all their work at home and at school
- ❖ Tell a teacher if anything is worrying them
- ❖ Go to bed at a sensible time
